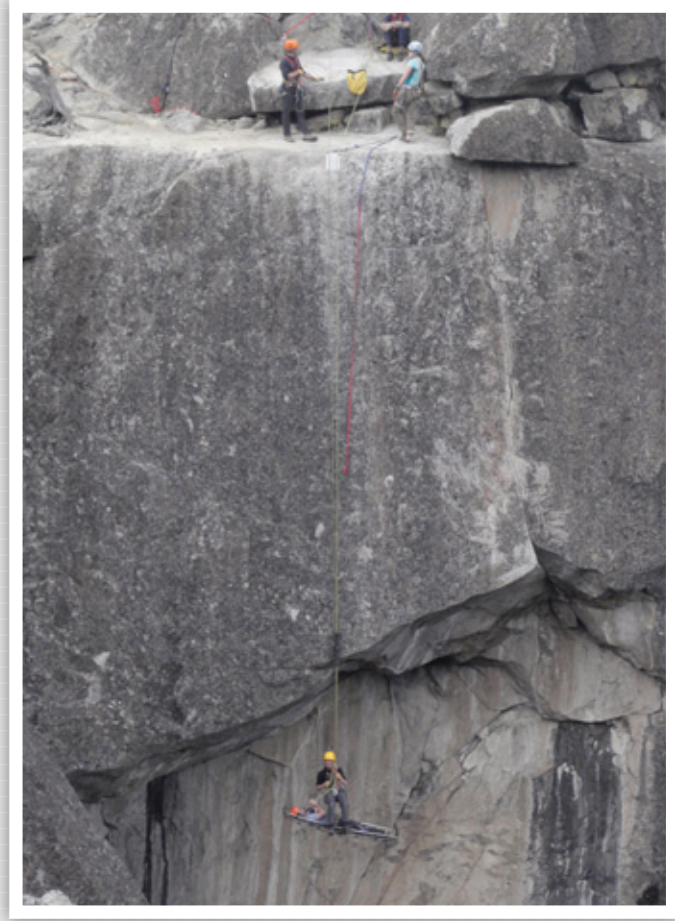

TETON COUNTY SEARCH AND RESCUE REPORT : TIMES AND SUMMARIES

June
Medical Issue in Coal Creek
6/11/13 › 10:07-14:00

Medical, Wheeled Litter, Helicopter
Summary: TCSOSAR advisors received a page at 9:50 for a medical condition near Moose Creek Meadows. Hiker reported abdominal pain and a fever and was no longer ambulatory. Ground crews mobilized with Hasty 1 running to the patient with basic skills and Hasty 2 following with the wheeled litter and medical supplies. Due to the concern for a life threatening

medical condition, Air Idaho was contacted to extract the patient. At 12:15 EIRMC heli was able to locate and transport the patient.

Lost Hikers on Jackson Peak
6/15/13 › 16:45-17:51

Missing Persons, Hikers
Summary: Two hikers called 911 and reported themselves lost after descending Jackson Peak. After speaking with the party it was determined that they were probably in Sheep Creek Drainage and TCSOSAR

volunteer was able to talk them back to their car.

Pilgrim Creek Lost Hikers
6/16/13 › 2:00-14:00

Hikers, Horseback, Missing Persons, Dog Teams, Civil Air Patrol
Summary: Two hikers were reported missing from the Pilgrim Creek Trailhead. Dog Teams and Civil Air Patrol responded to help search. Eight hasty teams were assembled and set out at 8:45. Horse team located missing party at 10:30.

Overdue Wind/Ice Cave

6/29/13 › 21:31-23:00

Wind/Ice Cave

Summary: At 21:31 TCSOSAR advisors were contacted regarding overdue hikers at the Wind/Ice Cave. At 23:00 the overdue hikers made contact.

July

Assist Sublette County with Wind River Search

7/1/13-7/3/13

Helicopters, Hikers, Missing Party, Interagency

Summary: TCSAR volunteers assisted Sublette County with a search for a missing person in the Wind River Range.

Buffalo Fork Inner Tube Rescue

7/6/13 › 14:14-17:15

Boaters, Interagency

Summary: At 14:45 TCSOSAR advisors received notification of a missing tuber on the Buffalo Fork. The volunteers dispatched with personal and team cataraft. GTNP set up downstream safety and upstream safety. The missing party was located.

Snow King Mountain Bike Accident

7/7/13 › 11:22-12:32

Wheeled Litter, Hikers, Bikers, Interagency

Summary: The TCSOSAR advisors were paged at 11:22 for an injured mountain biker on Snow King Mountain. The Advisors decided to use the wheeled litter to extract the patient. The patient was removed from the mountain and taken by ambulance to the hospital.

Darby Canyon Trail Injury

7/10/13 › 13:06-13:34

Medical, Interagency

Summary: A 911 call was received by TC Idaho dispatch for a female hiker with a reported broken elbow and knee injury, 1/4 mile in from the Darby Canyon Trailhead towards the Wind Cave. The patient's husband was the RP, he left her on the trail, hiked out and drove down the Darby Canyon Road until he could establish cell coverage. Teton County Idaho EMS responded and was on scene first. Teton Valley Dispatch called Jackson Dispatch and Jackson paged the SAR team out. After equipment was gathered from the SAR building and SAR was enroute over the pass, Idaho EMS called Jackson to stand the rescue down stating they could handle it. SAR was stood down with one SAR member continuing to the site. SAR volunteer and EMS carried the patient to the waiting ambulance for transport to the hospital.

Glory Hiker Injury

7/13/13 › 18:58-23:54

Hiker, Wheeled Litter

Summary: At 18:58 the TCSOSAR advisors were notified that a hiker fell while descending the Glory hiking trail with her husband and two sons. She sustained a lower tibia/fibula fracture and was in extreme pain and was unable to continue down from below "Hillary Step" on the trail to Glory summit. TCSAR volunteers arrived on scene and while a medical team packaged and treated hiker for pain and cold, another team rigged a series of belay line anchors

for the wheeled litter. With four attendants the patient was packaged in the wheeled litter and lowered in a series of multiple rope belays tied to the wheeled litter until she was secure and at the Teton Pass Road where she was transported to waiting ambulance Medic 1.

Snake River Canyon River Rescue

7/14/13 › 14:03-14:48

Kayak, Jet Boat

Summary: TCSOSAR Advisors were paged at 14:03 for a capsized kayak in the Snake River. SAR members were in the river recreating and were at the scene within minutes. SAR members assisted the two boaters to shore. The 2 boaters at that point said they were a party of 4 and their friends had not made it to the landing. After some conversations with other boaters, the other 2 people in the party were picked up by the Westbank Anglers dory.

Hoback Junction Fall

7/18/13 › 17:35-19:15

Medical, Climbing, High Angle, Interagency

Summary: At 17:35 SAR advisors were notified of a female who fell off a 15 foot cliff on the Hoback River. Fire/EMS responded first, located, assessed and packaged patient. TCSAR assisted in a lift of the patient over small rock steps and wheeled litter extraction.

Grassy Lakes Missing Person

7/19/13 › 17:03 - 7/20/13 › 15:00

Hikers, Missing Person, Medical, Helicopter, Dog Teams, Interagency

Summary: About 14:00 it was reported to the Boy Scout camp staff that a hiker was missing, he had last been seen at 6:00. The staff searched the camp, local area, and roads and trails in the area throughout the day with no sign of the subject. During background research it was discovered that the missing hiker had many medical conditions including hearing loss and a recent heart transplant. Considering these health concerns TCSAR elected to immediately mobilize to Camp Loll for a missing person search. The BTNF contract helicopter and a Helitak crew searched for about 2.5 hours at which time the helicopter needed to return to base for darkness.

TCSAR arrived late Friday evening at Camp Loll and began planning a ground search. SAR dispatched TCSAR volunteers into the field as well as to search the entire camp and lake. While SAR volunteers were searching, SAR IC and SAR Planners began working on a search plan for Saturday morning.

There were approximately 15 SAR volunteers, 5 GTNP Rangers, 1 BTNF official, 4 dog teams, and 50 Camp Loll Staffers ready to help. Search Teams arrived back at 2:00. Planning work was done until 3:30. At 07:00 SAR briefed all teams and sent everyone into the field into 13 different search areas.

At 09:03 a SAR Volunteer found the missing hiker. He was tired, dehydrated and hungry, he was treated by TCSAR member and they walked back to Camp Loll.

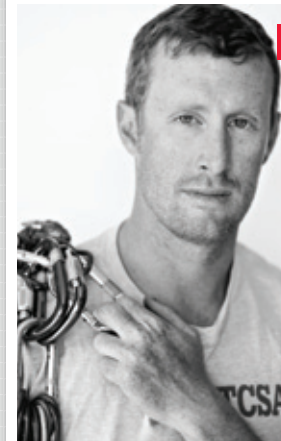

Munger Mountain Lost Hikers

7/21/13 > 16:20-18:10

Hikers, Medical, ATV's

Summary: At 16:20 the SAR BOD was alerted by dispatch of a lost couple hiking in the Munger Mountain area with a distress female that was lethargic, dehydrated and out of water. The team was dispatched with ATV's and by foot to the area. TCSOSAR volunteers were dispatched at 16:55 to search for missing party. At 17:10 contact with the party was made on foot. At 17:35 ATV's were able to transport the hikers to the trailhead.

Overtured Canoe

7/23/13 > 13:31-13:35

Summary: TCSO advisors callout for a reported overturned canoe with no subjects present near swinging bridge. The party was able to get canoe to shore shortly after and the incident ended.

Alaska Basin Hiker with Medical Issues

7/26/13 > 20:09-22:23

Summary: TCSOSAR was notified of a sick hiker in the Alaska Basin Area. The hiker was complaining of nausea, stomach pain, dizziness and a helicopter evacuation was planned. EIRMC helicopter was able to locate the patient and evacuate her to the hospital.

August

Darby Canyon Overdue Hikers

8/4/13 > 20:06-22:45

Hikers, Medical, Missing Persons

Summary: At 20:06 TCSOSAR advisors were notified

of two overdue hikers in the Darby Canyon area.

TCSOSAR volunteers responded to the Darby Canyon trailhead and began searching for the hikers at 21:30. At approximately 22:23 both hikers were found on the trail hiking out. One hiker was injured and had visual upper body and head injuries. He was treated by SAR volunteers and transferred to an ambulance which took him to the Driggs, ID hospital.

Fall Creek and Dog Creek Missing Person

8/5/13 > 13:14

Hikers, Horseback, Interagency

Summary: At 13:14 the TCSOSAR board received a call that a hiker was missing in the Dog Creek area. The RP had taken a nap and when she awoke the other hiker was gone. She had been missing 1.5 hours but had no medical issues and the weather was good so the team was not paged and the advisors continued investigation. At 14:13 the hiker was located.

Two Oceans Pass Hiker Injury

8/6/13 > 11:33

Hikers, Horseback, Helicopter, Medical, Interagency

Summary: At 11:41 the TCSOSAR advisors was called about a hiker with an ankle injury in the Two Oceans Pass area. Because of the patients injury and his location, a helicopter evacuation was planned. If a helicopter wasn't available, a horseback team would be backup. At 12:30 TCSOSAR volunteers arrived at Helitack. At 13:30 the patient was spotted. Patient was flown to Blackrock Ranger station and then taken by ambulance to the hospital.

Granite Basin Medical

8/6/13 › 14:24-17:56

Medical, Helicopter, Hikers, Interagency

Summary: A backcountry hiker showed signs of cardiac emergency on a backpacking trip. His leader, an EMT, reported that he had a history of tachycardia. Because of the patient condition, a helicopter evacuation was initiated. TCSOSAR volunteers and Helitack were able to locate the patient and fly him back to Helitack base where he was transported by ambulance to the hospital.

Jumping Rock Injury

8/11/13 › 14:10-16:20

Medical, Hikers, Interagency

Summary: TCSOSAR received a call for a male with medical issues. The team was paged for a wheeled litter call out. The team and Medic 10 dispatched to the GTNP boundary where the patient was located. Medic 10 took over the call and the patient walked out.

Rock Springs Buttress

8/14/2013 › 19:01-00:49

ATV's, Helicopter, Medical, Hikers

Summary: At 19:09 the TCSOSAR received a call that a hiker had fallen about one hour earlier and his condition was getting worse. The patient had fallen from a height but could not remember how high. Throughout the evening, updates from the RP informed TCSOSAR that this may be a head injury and the patient's health was continuing to decline. Sixteen SAR members were dispatched into the field via ATV's.

The patient was located after about an hour of hiking and searching. Because of the patients worsening condition, EIRMC helicopter was used to evacuate the patient. The patient was flown to the hospital.

Kings Wave Medical Assist

8/26/13 › 12:27-13:10

Boaters, Interagency, Medical

Summary: At 12:27 the TCSOSAR advisors were paged for medical assistance at the Kings Wave where a patient was complaining of heart discomfort and trouble breathing. TCSOSAR was paged to assist with packaging and transporting the patient. The call was stood down before TCSOSAR were on scene.

Teton Canyon Search

8/29/13 › 12:45-14:30

Missing Person, Helicopter, Interagency

Summary: At 10:40 a member of Teton County, ID SAR walked into the TCSOSAR hanger to report an overdue hiker. TCSOSAR contacted the RP for additional information. The RP's brother was new to the area, had no food and had missed his first day of work.

Due to those clues, TCSOSAR paged the team to search for the overdue hiker. Teton Helitack was contacted to assist with a flyover search and a dog team was put on standby. Two hasty teams began mobilizing to begin the search when the RP called back and reported she had found the hiker on the trail, just overdue.

September

Snow King Medical

9/9/13 › 10:09-13:29

UTV's, Medical, Interagency

Summary: At 10:14 TCSOSAR received a page for a hiker who collapsed on Snow King near Old Man Flats. The TCSOSAR advisors planned to take a UTV up to the patient to evacuate him. During this time Snow King maintenance crew heard about the incident and was able to drive a TCSOSAR volunteer in a Rhino ATV. The patient was transferred to Medic 10.

Flat Creek Horse Accident

9/10/13 › 14:22-18:55

Horseback, Medical, Helicopter

Summary: At 14:22 TCSOSAR advisors were paged concerning a medical rescue for a horse injury. The patient had been thrown from her horse. Due to injuries, remote location and extreme road and trail conditions, TCSOSAR advisors chose to use a helicopter evacuation with a backup ground crew. Helitack was available to help. Volunteers who were not flying to the scene, were sent with ATV's and medical equipment to the location of the patient. The patient was treated for injuries and flown to the hospital. The volunteers were then picked up by the volunteers on ATV's to return everyone to town.

Wolverine Creek Injured Hunter

9/12/13 › 11:03-20:50

Helicopter, Medical, Interagency

Summary: At 11:03 TCSOSAR advisors received a

call regarding a possible bear mauling and an injured patient with possible broken leg. Due to the location of the patient and the medical urgency, a helicopter evacuation was planned. Teton Helitack was used to transport TCSOSAR volunteers to evacuate the patient. The patient was then transferred to Medic 2.

Holmes Cave Trailhead Horseback

9/15/13 › 11:31-17:19

Horseback, Medical

Summary: At 11:36 TCSOSAR advisors received a call for a hunter injured after falling off his horse. The RP reported that his father complained of pain and was unable to walk. A wheeled litter evacuation was planned. At 13:10 Hasty teams were dispatched into the field on horseback and foot with medical equipment and the wheeled litter. At 14:27 the patient was being moved towards the trailhead. At 15:06 the patient was transferred to Medic 3.

Bear Canyon Spot Beacon

9/20/13 › 14:39-21:33

SPOT Locator, Helicopter, Medical

Summary: At 14:47 the TCSOSAR advisors received a page regarding a SPOT 911 activation. The patient was a male with heart issues. Given the remote location and medical urgency, the advisors decided to use the helicopter to evacuate the patient. Primary plan was to use Helitack, secondary plan EIRMC, and backup plan was a ground evacuation. At 15:54 helitack was airborne. At 15:49 the SPOT was deactivated and after discussion the mission was

called off. At 17:19 dispatch received a call stating there still was an emergency with the patient. At this point, a helicopter evacuation was still the best plan and EIRMC was contacted due to their higher level of medical care. At 19:48 EIRMC evacuated the patient. An investigation into the SPOT calls found that the SPOT was accidentally cancelled.

Teton Wilderness Injured Party

9/25/13 › 15:28-18:36

Horseback, Hikers, Medical, Helicopter, Interagency

Summary: At 15:30 TCSOSAR advisors received a call that a man was thrown from his horse and kicked in the face. It was reported possible shock, possible broken jaw and unable to ride his horse out of the wilderness. The patient was located northeast of Heart 6 Ranch. The incident location was 3-5 miles from the trailhead with a fresh 6-12 inches of snow on the ground. Given the remote location and medical emergency, helicopter evacuation was the best plan. The primary plan was to use Teton Helitack. Permission was granted to use the helicopter. Because of the timing and weather, the team was paged to create a backup ground evacuation. At 17:00 the helicopter was en route to the scene. At 17:45 the patient was transferred to Medic 3.

October **Spread Creek Search**

10/4/13 › 0:59-11:05

Missing Person, ATVs

Summary: At 1:21 TCSOSAR advisors received a

call about an overdue party near Spread Creek south of Togwotee Pass. Due to hunters' abilities, weather forecast, and no known location the search was set for daylight hours. At 6:20 the hunters were still missing and the team was paged for a search. TCSOSAR team departed the hanger at 8:15 with ATV's and UTV's. At 9:44 the Reporting Party reported to Dispatch that the missing party had been located.

Teton Pass Vehicle over the Edge

10/5/13 › 10:26-14:25

Fire/EMS Assist, High Angle, Medical, Helicopter

Summary: At 10:33 the TCSOSAR team received a page about a car over the edge of Teton Pass near Mail Cabin. One passenger had sustained serious injuries and was possibly entrapped in the vehicle. The TCSOSAR team responded to the scene and was able to set up a low angle system to extract the patient and create a safe environment for Fire/EMS/TCSAR personnel to work. The patient was extracted from the vehicle and safely raised to street level. EIRMC helicopter transported the patient for further medical attention.

Teton Village Missing Person

10/5/13 › 22:08-00:43

GTNP Assist, Missing Person

Summary: At 22:08 TCSOSAR received a call that the Reporting Party's roommate had not returned from his run. Last time anyone had spoken with him was 8:30. 22:09 his vehicle was located in the Ranch Lot. The RP was positive he was not prepared to spend the night. 22:30 missing person's bicycle

and jacket are located at the Death Canyon trailhead. 22:38 GTNP rangers are called. 23:03 TCSOSAR asks GTNP rangers to drive road from Jenny Lake to Death Canyon looking for the missing person. GTNP ranger locates missing person.

Crystal Creek Overdue hunter

10/16/13 › 15:32-15:51

Summary: At 15:32 the Board received a page reporting a lost hunter in the Gros Ventre area. At 15:51 the hunter was located.

Cow Creek Missing Hunters

10/23/13 › 14:26-14:47

Missing Persons

Summary: At 14:26 TCSOSAR advisors received a call that the reporting party's father had not returned to the vehicle with the other two hunters. While talking with the RP, the father returned to the vehicle.

November

Breccia Peak Rescue

11/01/13 › 15:32-17:40

Avalanche, Helicopter, Skiers, Medical Personnel

Summary: At 15:37 TCSOSAR received a call regarding a female with a possible broken leg who was involved in an avalanche near Togwotee Pass. Given the remote location, avalanche hazard and medical urgency it was decided the best plan was to use a helicopter evacuation with a backup plan to use snowmobiles for extraction. The TCSOSAR helicopter left the TCSOSAR hanger at 16:16. At 16:54 the helicopter was available to land on scene and extract the patient. At 17:11 the patient was transferred to Medic 10.

Jackson Peak Rescue

11/10/13 › 16:33-21:28

Avalanche, Skiers, Helicopter, Snowmobilers, Medical Personnel

Summary: At 16:35 TCSOSAR received a page regarding a male with a possible leg fracture who was involved in an avalanche on the west face of Jackson Peak. At 17:15, 2 volunteers were flown to the patient by the TCSOSAR helicopter. Because of sunset, the helicopter returned to the hanger. At 17:23 EIRMC helicopter was requested to fly to the scene using night vision. At 17:45 the remaining volunteers drove snowmobiles to the Goodwin Lake trailhead and prepared for a snowmobile evacuation. At 18:30 EIRMC helicopter was able to locate and extract the patient.

Woods Motel Medical Assist

11/15/13 › 14:02-15:36

High Angle Rope Rescue, Medical Assist

Summary: JH Fire/EMS requested TCSOSAR volunteers for a high angle rope rescue of a patient at a construction site who had fallen approximately 16 feet. Volunteers responded to the scene and were able to set up a raise and lift the patient to street level. ■
